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

The portfolio includes the key "KSB" project that boasts indicated and inferred resources of 7.3Mt @ 2.7g/t Au & 0.08% Co for a total of 650,000oz Au and 5,800t Co.


Following shareholder approval, DCX intends to raise up to 4 million AUD and change its name to Latitude 66 Limited.

<u>European Energy Metals</u> announced an amendment to a previous earn-in agreement concerning Capella Minerals Finnish Lithium project. Under the new agreement, European Energy Metals can acquire 100% interest in the project by paying 250,000 dollars in cash and the issue of 1,100,000 million shares as well as a 2% NSR to Capella. The project covers a large area of prospective ground (approx. 2,500 km²) in the vicinity of the Keliber/Sibanye-Stillwater project.




Exploration claims and reservations in relation to Keliber's landholdings (Source:

<u>GreenRoc Mining</u> announced that the Government of Greenland approved the enlargement of its 2022-03 mineral exploration license, increasing the company's landholdings surrounding the Amitsoq graphite deposit to 114km². The newly granted area lies east of the town of Nanortalik and contains historic records about high-grade graphite mineralization.

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<u>Great Northern Minerals</u> published results from preliminary magnetic separation testwork of lithium-bearing minerals from its Kuusisuo project. The rejects from three previously analyzed rock chip samples were sieved to produce five different fractions of crusher fines. Ocular inspection of the fractions revealed that the 0.125mm-0.25mm fraction had the best liberation results. Subsequent magnetic separation of this fraction returned recoveries of between 96-98% of lithium in the magnetic concentrates.

The company is currently planning an exploration license application in preparation for a drill program.

On a further note, <u>Bluejay Mining</u> advised that its trading facility will be moved from the OTCQB market to the Pink market, <u>Greenland Resources</u> advised it applied for an exploitation license for its Malmbjerg molybdenum project, <u>Rupert Resources</u> announced the retirement of Mr George Ogilvie from its board of directors, <u>Endomines</u> published an operational update for the period Jan-March 2024, <u>Bluelake Mineral</u> filed an exploitation concession application for the mineralization at Gjersvik, a satellite deposit to Joma, <u>Amaroq Minerals</u> reported the first successful underground mining blast as part of trial mining activities at Nalunaq and <u>Terrafame</u> decided to halt production at its battery chemicals plant for four weeks due to national strikes in Finland.
